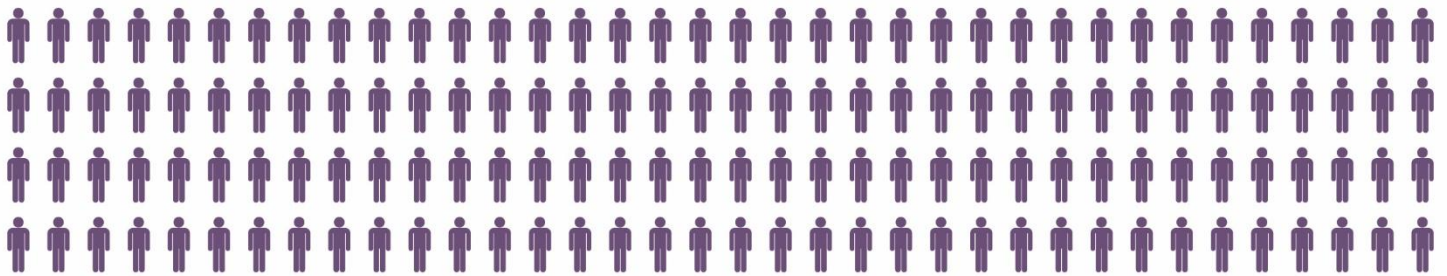
Health and Safety Statistics 2017-2018

The following graphic illustrates the key findings from the 2017-18 Annual Statistics Report for Great Britain, released by the HSE. These numbers show a 4.9 per cent increase in fatal injuries compared to 2016-17 data. Although small, such an increase is a concern that should be taken seriously across industries. Not to

mention, many of the injuries and fatalities that occurred could have been prevented through simple safety measures. As you read through these statistics, consider what your organisation can do to improve workplace health and safety practices.

Organisations paid **£72.6 million** in total fines resulting from prosecutions (or referrals to COPFS in Scotland) where a conviction took place this year.
